Let us walk in newness of life.

When we were baptised in Christ Jesus we were
baptised in his death; in other words, when we were
baptised, we went into the tomb with him and joined
him in death, so that as Christ was raised from the
dead by the Father's glory, we too might live a new life.

If in union with Christ we have imitated his death, we shall
also imitate him in his resurrection. We must realise that
our former selves have been crucified with him to destroy
this sinful body and to free us from the slavery of sin.
When a man dies, of course, he has finished with sin.

But we believe that having died with Christ we shall return
to life with him: Christ, as we know, having been raised
from the dead will never die again. Death has no power
over him any more.

Matthew 25:31-46

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Come, you whom my Father has blessed.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes
in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his
seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be
assembled before him and he will separate men one from
another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He
will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his
left. Then the King will say to those on his right hand,
"Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your
heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the
foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave
me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a
stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you
clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you
came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in
reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or
thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a
stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you;
sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will
answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one
of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me."
Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from
me, with your curse upon you, to eternal fire prepared for
the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never
gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me
anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made
me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in
prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn
to ask, "Lord when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a
stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to
your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in
so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of
these, you neglected to do it to me." And they will go away
to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.'

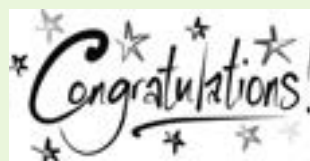

REFLECTION by Nick Brodie

Drawing our attention to how Jesus' death manifested the most 'radical poverty', Pope Leo reminds us that
Jesus 'died as an outcast'. God became human, sharing in our experiences of rejection and suffering – even
death.

On this basis, the Pope affirms, Christ 'asks us, his Church, to make a decisive and radical choice in favour of
the weakest.' We are called to be a compassionate Church, a people prepared to share the suffering of others in
order to lift them up. We are called to be 'a Church of the Beatitudes, one that makes room for the little ones and
walks poor with the poor, a place where the poor have a privileged place.'

After all, the Pope says, Jesus came into human history 'not only as a poor Messiah, but also as the Messiah of
and for the poor.' His followers therefore are called to follow him in this 'preference for the poor.' We are all
summoned to 'become an image of Christ and his mercy towards the weakest.'

Therefore, as the Pope declares: 'The clear and forceful words of the Gospel must be put into practice.' Like the
earliest Christians, who 'had no doubt' about their charitable responsibilities, we must learn to follow Jesus 'by
placing charity towards all at the centre' of everything we do.
